## The Search for the Hay Hollow Draw Eriogonum Gypsophilum Population

Notes by Phil Tonne: August 2000

12 June 2000 - Negative survey by Phil Tonne. Spent several hours searching for the population - accidentally included private land in the survey (noticed later on ownership map). No plants.

1999 or 2000: Bob Sivinski goes to the location as mapped in Knight 1993 and failed to locate it.

Bob thinks Bill Dunmire might have found this population. I (Phil Tonne) spoke with Bill Dunmire and he looked through his notes/reports and only found information about the Ben Slaughter population.

I e-mailed John Sherman (John S Sherman@nm.blm.gov), Carlsbad BLM. After no response, I went and looked at the Knight 1993 area and expanded the search up and down the draw, West of the road and fence line, and East of the 24/19/25/30 bench mark.

I checked in at the BLM office hoping to speak with J. Sherman but he is on vacation. Steve Daly gave me access to their files and a thorough search showed nothing but the Knight report that mentions this population.

Steve (Steve Daly@nm.blm.gov) thinks that Jesse Juen (now in Tucson at (520) 722-4289), formerly at the BLM office in the 1980s might have found this population. Steve called Jesse and e-mailed him. No response until the next day. Jesse remembers finding a population, associated with a spring, and says he filled out a data sheet on it. Steve looked through John's files and couldn't find anything about it.

Paul Knight looked through his notes. He has notes that the population was reported in '87 and '92. When Paul went, 21 September 1993 he noted: "no plants or confined to private land." He believes that his information about the location, the '87 and '92 reports 606 would have been in his files when he worked for the State. He doesn't know where those files are now.

Steve was going to have John look for Jesse's data forms but as yet none have been located.

It seems logical to go and check at Butcher Spring and see if the plants are there. Most of the land surrounding the draw at Butcher Spring is private and the woman that owns it lives in Texas.
